Your Action Plan will help to establish a long and short-term comprehensive SRTS Plan for the school and surrounding community. Your school will be chosen based upon its interest, its current work with SRTS and the current condition of its surroundings.

The Action Plan will include recommendations, strategies and activities and will outline the 5 Es of SRTS (Engineering, Evaluation, Education, Encouragement, and Enforcement).
